



Pen Eater

Description

A very practical little monster that keeps your favorite pens handy for when you want to plan your days. Ideal for small amounts of yarn and super easy to customize!

Abbreviations

st(sts) – stitch(stitches)
 ch – chain
 HDC – half double crochet
 sc – single crochet
 2sc – 2 single crochet in the same stitch (+1)
 2HDC – 2 half double crochet in the same stitch (+1)
 CC – color of choice

Material

3.25 mm crochet hook
 Yarn – fingering weight yarn, less than 20g total
 Yarn needle to weave in ends
 White buttons (2 for the eyes– optional)
 Black thread and needle (for the eyes – optional)

Gauge & instructions

Obtaining gauge isn't critical, you can work more stitches to your starting chain if you want a larger finished item and you could add more rounds for a longer item. The idea is to use up leftover fingering weight yarn and have fun!

Pen holder

Setup: With CC, ch 12 turn, HDC to end, 2HDC in last st, then HDC to end along the other side of the starting chain, 2HDC in the last stitch (24) **You will now be working in continuous rounds, you can mark your first stitch or count sts for each rounds.**

Rounds 1-25) HDC around (24) Finish off, weave in ends.

You can use any color combination you like, make large stripes or even go monochrome!

Eyes (optional – make 2)

Round 1) Work 10 sc in a magic ring (10)

Round 2) 2sc around (20) **Finish off leaving a long tail for assembly. You can use buttons or felt to make the inner eye!**

Strap –ou will need to adjust the length of the strap according to the size of your planner, notebook or binder, so that the Pen Eater isn't stretched too much when in place. Since my binder is about 25 cm tall, I made the strap about 30 to 35 cm long, then worked 4 rows in HDC before finishing off and leaving a long tail for assembly.

Assembly

Sew one end of the strap 3-4 rounds below the opening and sew the other end to the starting chain. Weave in all ends. Sew the eyes to the top of the opening on the same side as the strap.
